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1	1.1. The Declaration of Independence as a Zionist Tool
2	Submitted by ARZENU,
3	The International Federation of Reform and Progressive Religious Zionists
4 5	Whereas the Declaration of Independence is the charter for the redemption of the Jewish people through the creation of an inclusive and democratic Jewish State; and
6	$\ensuremath{\textbf{Whereas}}$ the Declaration of Independence states that the State will be based on freedom,
7	justice and peace as envisaged by the Prophets of Israel; will ensure complete equality of
8	social and political rights to all its inhabitants irrespective of religion, race, or sex; will
9	guarantee freedom of religion, conscience, language, education and culture; and will
10	safeguard the Holy Places of all religions; and
11 12	Whereas there is clear evidence that these objectives toward which we continue to aspire have not yet been fully realized,
13	Therefore the Zionist Congress XXXVII hereby resolves that:
14	1. The World Zionist Organization implement programs intended to teach and educate
15	Israelis and Jews around the world about the fundamental principles embedded in the
16 17	Declaration of Independence and to fulfill the ideals of the Declaration of Independence, specifically with regard to ensuring complete equality of social and political rights to all of
17	its inhabitants irrespective of religion, race, gender, or sexual orientation.
19	 The World Zionist Organization is mandated to implement programs to fulfill the ideals of
20	the Declaration of Independence with specific attention to those that guarantee religious
21	freedom and equal treatment for all streams of Judaism.
22	3. The World Zionist Organization is mandated to implement policies to ensure that all
23	National Institutions operate in accordance with these goals and ideals.
24 25	4. The World Zionist Organization is mandated to implement programs that ensure that all Zionist federations operate in accordance with these goals and ideals; and
26	5. To insure that any Zionist federation not complying with these guidelines receive no
27	funding or support from the World Zionist Organization and that all penalties approved in
28	February 2015 by the Zionist General Council are applied.
29	6. The World Zionist Organization calls upon the Government of Israel to support the WZO in
30	the above initiatives by allocating appropriate funds for these projects to be implemented
31	successfully.

33	1.2. Non-Stop Zionism

35 36	Whereas in recent years there has been a growth of post-Zionist voices from within sections of Israeli society and the Diaspora; and
37	Whereas the challenges confronting the Jewish people continue to increase, including virulent
38	Antisemitism and the delegitimization of the State of Israel; and
39	$\ensuremath{\textbf{Whereas}}$ there is a state of crisis in Diaspora Jewry, involving escalating assimilation and
40	alienation from Jewish identity,
41	The Zionist Congress XXXVII hereby resolves:
42	1. To establish Aliyah to the State of Israel and the continued ingathering of the exiles as the

43 Zionist movement's ultimate value.

1 2	2. That Jewish-Zionist education shall be at the center of Zionist activity in the Diaspora and in Israel, with an expansion of Hebrew language study, as the national language of the
3	Jewish people.
4 5	3. To enhance the activities of the Magshimim youth movements and the expansion of activity among students on campus.
6 7	4. To empower and extend those programs building a connection between Israel and the Diaspora.
8	5. To call upon the young generation in Israel and the Diaspora to participate in the Zionist

To enhance the recognition that there are varied streams of Judaism, religious and spiritual, within the Jewish people and that it is imperative to work to raise the level of mutual recognition and tolerance, and towards their equal status within the Jewish people

The WZO will promote initiatives that aim to return youth and the public at large to the Jewish bookshelf, promote the study of Judaism, Land of Israel, and the history of the Jewish people. The WZO will promote the establishment of Zionist entities at universities and will initiate Zionist activity in institutes of higher education.

40 41	Whereas the nature of Israeli society, and the integration of olim into it, are major concerns of the Zionist movement, as stipulated in the Jerusalem Program adopted by the ZGC 34/2,
42 43 44	and Whereas numerous resolutions regarding these areas have been passed by Zionist Congresses and the Zionist General Council but have not been acted upon, and

Whereas the World Zionist Organization currently has no mechanism for furthering the 1 2 objectives of such resolutions, particularly those dealing with legislation in the Knesset, 3 The Zionist Congress XXXVII hereby resolves: 4 That the Zionist Executive and the Presidium of the ZGC jointly establish a Forum on the 5 Character of Israeli Society and its Relationship with the Diaspora that will, among other things, serve as the lobby of the WZO to advance legislation and cooperation with the 6 7 Government of Israel in order to actualize the platform of The Jerusalem Program, including 8 the preservation of Israel as a Jewish and Democratic State, the recognition of the multi-9 faceted nature of the Jewish people, and the fashioning of Israel as an exemplary society. 10 Be it further resolved that the Executive examine the feasibility and efficacy of retaining a 11 professional lobbyist to advance the objectives of the Zionist movement. 12 13 1.5. Increased Support for the Magshimim Youth Movements 14 Submitted by the World Meretz Union Faction 15 Whereas the Magshimim youth movements were established in the Diaspora, founded upon 16 the Zionist vision, as manifested in the settlement of Israel and cultivation of the land; and 17 Whereas the youth movements have always labored for human improvement and Tikkun 18 Olam, and believe and strive to educate the succeeding generations in the values of pluralism, 19 Zionism and democracy; and 20 Whereas the Magshimim youth movements today still maintain a collective lifestyle that is 21 consistent with the ideological lifestyle upon which they were established; and 22 Whereas the Magshimim youth movements to this very day are settling in the socio-economic 23 and geographical periphery throughout Israel; and 24 Whereas the Magshimim Zionist youth movements in Israel and around the world represent 25 an important component in the ideological and values-based continuity of Israel, 26 The Zionist Congress XXXVII hereby resolves: 27 1. To continue to work to promote the activities and existence of the Magshimim Zionist 28 youth movements and to increase their budgets by no less than 25% and to conduct 29 negotiations with the movements on the manner of implementation of this resolution. 30 2. To connect secular society in the Diaspora via secular activity centers and to conduct 31 joint seminars: encounters between Israeli youth movements and Diaspora youth. 32 33 1.6. Use of the "Hagshama Department" branding alongside 34 the Department for Diaspora Activities 35 Submitted by the World Meretz Union Faction The Zionist Congress XXXVII hereby resolves: 36 37 To return to the use of the brand name of "The Hagshama Department" while finding a way 38 to mention "The Department for Diaspora Activities." 39 40 **1.7.** Appropriate Response to Nationalism, Racism and Fear of the Other 41 Submitted by the World Meretz Union Faction 42 Whereas Zionism is a movement that advocates the principles of justice, equality and

43 democracy, as detailed in the Constitution of the World Zionist Organization; and

1 Whereas, for many years, the Jewish people suffered persecution, genocide, pogroms, and

- 2 many became refugees in different countries; and
- 3 Whereas the Jewish people's tradition commands us to be fair and equitable towards gentiles
- 4 residing in our midst:
- 5 In Mishneh Torah by the Rambam, Laws of Kings and Wars, Chapter 8:
- 6 "Anyone who accepts the Seven [Noachide] Laws and is scrupulous in their observance shall
- 7 thus be considered one of the Righteous Gentiles and shall have a share in the world to come.
- 8 And whoever accepts and observes them because the Holy One Blessed be He commanded
- 9 the Torah and communicated to us by the hand of Moses, our Teacher, that the sons of Noah
- 10 had been so commanded previously. If, however, he observes them out of intellectual
- 11 conviction then he is not a resident alien, nor is he one of the Righteous Gentiles or their
- 12 Sages." (From which implies that asylum seekers, Muslims and Christians of African origin –
- 13 are thus resident aliens.)

- "And a stranger shall you not wrong, nor shall you oppress him, for you were strangers in theland of Egypt."

- 23 Whereas, according to data from the Migration Authority for April 2015, there are 45,711
- asylum seekers and refugees living in Israel, 92% of whom are from Eritrea or Sudan; and
- 25 Whereas state persecution, civil wars, acts of genocide and other atrocities have compelled
- them to leave their homes and their countries of birth, in search of protection in Israel; and
- Whereas between 5,000 and 7,000 of all the asylum seekers are survivors from the torture camps in Sinai and carry the scars of incarceration and cruel torture on their bodies and in their coulse and
- 29 their souls; and
- 30 **Whereas**, over the years, the asylum seekers have not had access to the recognition 31 procedure as refugees. Even today, the level of recognition as refugees in Israel is below 1%.
- procedure as refugees. Even today, the level of recognition as refugees in Israel is below 1%,
 while in the rest of the world the percentage of recognized Eritreans and Sudanese refugees
- 33 stands at 84% and 69% respectively; and
- 34 **Whereas** thousands of men and women asylum seekers live in various cities of Israel without 35 any regularized status, without work permits and without access to essential health and 36 welfare services, legal aid or housing; and
- 37 Whereas, since the government's increased stringency of policy, beginning with the operation
- 38 of the "Holot" center and the reduction of activity by the Population Registry, there has been
- 39 a discernible trend towards extreme desperation and a feeling of helplessness among that
- community. Many express their lack of sense of security and a fear for the future, as well as a
 sense of inability to take control and impact on the direction of their lives; and
- 42 Whereas the residents of southern Tel Aviv are in a state of distress as the result of the
- 43 inappropriate integration of asylum seekers in that area and the lack of preparation on the
- 44 ground to receive them in terms of budgets and infrastructure,
- 45 **The Zionist Congress XXXVII hereby resolves:**

1 2	1. That siding with and assisting these war refugees is the mission of the Jewish people and the Jewish state, because we were strangers in the land of Egypt.
3 4 5	2. The WZO Executive shall grant special and additional allocations to the Magshimim movements working to alleviate their conditions through informal education.
6	1.8. The Multi-Faceted Nature of the Zionist Movement

9	Whereas, the official platform of the World Zionist movement is stated in the words of the
10	Jerusalem Program which explicitly recognizes the multi-faceted nature of the Jewish people;

12	Whereas, the Zionist movement, from the days of Theodor Herzl to the present, has been a
13 14	pluralistic movement that recognizes that there is a place for diverging opinions and positions within the framework of the official platform; and
15	Whereas, those who seek to discredit Zionism and its ideals, often portray our movement in
	narrow and inaccurate terms that would undermine this commitment to diversity and inclusiveness,
18	The Zionist Congress XXXVII instructs the Zionist Executive to take all necessary steps to
	insure that the institutions, departments, committees and affiliated bodies of the World Zionist Organization and their leadership:
21	1. Accept and follow the principle that the only condition for participation in the Zionist
22	movement is fulfillment of requirements stated in the Constitution of the World Zionist
23	Organization (including, in particular, Articles 2, 5, 7 and 9 thereof and acceptance of the
24	Jerusalem Program.)
25	2. Respect the positive value of such diversity of opinions within the framework of the
26	Jerusalem Program expressed by members of the Zionist movement, and
27	3. Refrain from any actions or communication that seek to restrict Zionism to one view or
28	opinion, or seek to impair good faith discussion within the Zionist Movement of divergent
29 30	views.
31	1.9. Hebrew Language #1

33	Whereas Hebrew is the modern and ancient language of the Jewish People; and
34	Whereas we aspire to make Hebrew the <i>lingua franca</i> of the global Jewish people; and
35	Whereas Hebrew is an effective tool for outreach and education about Israel, Israeli culture,
36	and Zionism;
37	Whereas Hebrew is the key to unlocking the sacred texts of the Jewish people, and plays an
38	essential role in building and affirming Jewish identity;
39	Whereas Hebrew education is one of the major planks of the Jerusalem Program and a
40	unifying principle of Zionism; and
41	Whereas facility with Hebrew serves as an essential tool for successful Aliyah and absorption;
42	Whereas we note the important role played by the World Zionist Organization in the
	establishment of the Hebrew Language Council in North America;
	Whereas the Hebrew Language Council provides programming, events and a framework to
45	raise Hebrew higher on the agenda of the North American community, inspiring others to

1	support and engage in Hebrew activity and culture and reinforcing Hebrew as an essential tool
2 3	for global Jewish leadership; Whereas the Hebrew Language Council brings together thought leaders, policy makers, and
4	institution across the spectrum of the Jewish community and serves to further engage native
5	Hebrew speakers in North American with the organized Jewish community in a positive and
6	affirming manner;
7	Whereas the Hebrew Language Council can expand the market for Hebrew resources, creating
8 9	efficiencies and costs that continue to serve as barrier to use for many individuals, organizations and communities:
10	Whereas the Hebrew Language Council has played a vital role in bringing many elements in
11	North America together to further the promotion and teaching of the Hebrew Language; in
12	helping Hebrew language teachers finds ways to work together and improve their skills as
13	Hebrew teachers; and is finding way to effectively share and leverage various relevant
14	resources,
15	The Zionist Congress XXXVII hereby resolves:
16	1. The World Zionist Organization ensure that the Hebrew Language Council will remain
17	active and will be a part of the Zionist Program in North America, its activities be replicated
18	in other countries, and will be administered and operated through the local Zionist
19	Federation;
20	2. The World Zionist Organization provide sufficient funding to enable the HLC and other
21	such pilots programs to maintain its current or increased level of activity;
22 23	 The World Zionist Organization provide redirect funding for Hebrew education materials in a manner that facilitates collaboration and decreased costs for the end-users;
25 24	 The World Zionist Organization build upon the successes of the HLC in North America to
25	replicate its efforts in other Zionist Federations.

27	1.10. A Free People in Our Land: Document of Agreement
28	Submitted by Eliezer Shefer, World Organization of Orthodox Communities
29	and Synagogues in Israel and the Diaspora
30	Whereas a tradition of cooperation in leadership and management has existed for many years
31	among the Zionist Unions and Organizations within the elected entities and the Executive of
32	the World Zionist Organization; and
33	Whereas political, conceptual and ideological differences of opinion exist between partners
34	to the leadership of the Zionist movement,
35	The Zionist Congress XXXVII resolves:
36	To charge the elected institutions to compose a document of understanding within three
37	months agreed by as many of the component parts of the Zionist Executive as possible, which
38	sets down the following principles:
39	1. It is agreed by the representatives of the Unions and the Organizations that one is to
40	refrain from discussion and decisions on theologically contested issues;
41	2. The Congress determines that the Zionist movement is a multi-cultural movement and its
42 43	members are called upon to respect one another's positions and opinions.
44	1.11. Unity of the Jewish People

2 escalating Antisemitism worldwide and the growth of delegitimization targeted against the 3 Jewish people and the State of Israel; and 4 Whereas cracks have recently appeared on important issues within the communities of the 5 world, and between them and the State of Israel; and 6 Whereas past experience has proven that it is only possible to attain achievements and 7 preserve the Jewish people and the State through unity of the Jewish people, reciprocal 8 respect and unity of purpose; and 9 Whereas the situation in the Middle East has deteriorated over recent years and threats 10 against the State of Israel are being heard, and whereas the support of world Jewry is vital at this time, more than ever, 11 12 The Zionist Congress XXXVII resolves: 13 1. A joint forum shall be established between the World Zionist Organization and the Israel 14 Government to coordinate activity, support Israeli Hasbara (advocacy) and the 15 mobilization of world Jewry to help the Israel Government and the State of Israel. 16 2. Disputes and differences of opinion are legitimate, but should be confined within the 17 parameters of the Jewish community, and between the communities of the world and the 18 State of Israel. 19 3. The Congress is aware of the state of emergency in which the State of Israel finds itself, 20 and it is therefore incumbent upon us to express support for the Israel Government in its 21 fight on behalf of the people and its security. 22 23 1.12. The Restitution of Jewish Refugees' Property 24 Submitted by World Likud 25 Whereas 850,000 Jews were expelled by force and with cruelty, and uprooted from their 26 homes in Arab lands, North Africa and the Persian Gulf, and dispossessed of their property, 27 which was stolen from them; and 28 Whereas the question of the expulsion of Jews has been neglected and ignored for decades, 29 in Israel and around the world, and as a result of which the issue of the rights and 30 compensation of hundreds of thousands of Jewish refugees from Arab lands and North Africa 31 has also been neglected and ignored; and 32 Whereas at every international dialogue about human rights and agreement between Arabs 33 and Jews it is imperative to assign precedence to this distressing international issue, viz., of 34 human rights' violations against Jewish refugees from Arab countries, 35 The Zionist Congress XXXVII resolves as follows: 36 1. The Congress calls upon the Zionist Executive to appeal to all countries in the world to 37 support a historic resolution adopted by the US Congress in April 2008. 38 It recognizes: the rights of Jewish refugees from Arab lands and North Africa as a pre-39 condition for any comprehensive and just peace agreement in the Middle East; 40 and emphasizes concern over: human rights' violations, expulsion by force, dispossession and property confiscation of Jews who were uprooted from their homes. 41 42 2. The Congress calls upon the Zionist Executive to devote its resources to promote activities 43 for the restoration of property to Jewish refugees from Arab lands and North Africa, and 44 to act to prevent the neglect and suppression heretofore on the issue of the Jewish 45 refugees from Arab lands.
